PROPOSAL FOR METEGHAN REPAVING SIDEWALK REPAIRS

The Meteghan sidewalk was the first in Clare, built in the late 1970's, and is showing its age.

Meteghan is arguably the 'capital of Clare' and is a busy place all year round. Having four long-

term care facilities for seniors, a few low-income apartments and numerous places of business, the

wheelchairs and other walking aids, it would widen the parking lane on the side of the road. This

would be a benefit around busy areas such as the church, many businesses and the Villa Acadienne.

The money spent on repairing the sidewalk in Meteghan would be a good investment in our

community; it would encourage people of all ages to get outdoors and be more active. This, in

turn, could even reduce the cost of our health care in the future.


